

TODAY'S MUSIC: "We'll Understand It Better By and By" by Charles Albert Tindley

We are often tossed and driv'n on the restless sea of time, somber skies and howling tempest oft succeed a bright sunshine; in that land of perfect day, when the mists have rolled away, we will understand it better by and by.

"Tossed and driven" describes Tindley's early life. His father was a slave, but his mother was free, thus Tindley was free. His mother died when he was only two and his father was forced to "hire him out." Hired-out workers often labored alongside slaves, but with two major differences - he was paid and he was free to go home.

As a young man he made a rule to learn at least one new thing each day. Primarily self-taught, he never graduated from college or seminary, yet acquired and read more than 8,000 books in his library. He learned Greek through Boston School of Theology and Hebrew through a synagogue in Philadelphia and was awarded two honorary doctorates of divinity.

In 1902 he was assigned to Bainbridge Street Methodist Church in Philadelphia, where he had been employed as a janitor for 16 years. Though 17 years had passed, people still remembered Tindley as a janitor and his return as pastor was not universally appreciated. But the church's 150th anniversary journal notes that "All were pleasantly surprised, for as Tindley mounted the rostrum he had the dignified bearing acquired during his previous appointments." They were further surprised when he delivered a masterful sermon. He was a captivating preacher and took an active role in the betterment of the people in his community. His songs were an outgrowth of his preaching ministry, often introduced during his sermons.

Silas Vail was born in Brooklyn and became a prominent and successful businessman. Though an amateur composer, he was very prolific in compiling song collections. Prohibitionists Horace Walters and W. F. Sherwin requested his services to compile *Songs of Grace and Glory* (1874) to support this movement. According to Fanny Crosby's book, *Memories of Eighty Years* (1906), Vail brought the poet one of his new melodies: "Toward the close of a day in 1874 I was sitting in my room thinking of the nearness of God through Christ as the constant companion of my pilgrim journey, when my heart burst out with the words." Thus, **Close to Thee**, was born

Thou, my everlasting portion, More than friend or life to me; All along my pilgrim journey, Savior, let me walk with Thee.
